### New Student and Qualifying Exam

New students are required to take a 30-minute qualifying exam. The exam is FREE to all students who are interested. There is a one-time \$50.00 New Student Registration fee for students to enroll for the first time. Qualifying exams are required for new students who would like to take math competition classes.
